2) Your friend has been teased online by someone in another class. They've come to you for help. Do you....?

- D. Laugh; if its just online, it doesn't matter, they should ignore it

3) You've recently been messaged by someone you don't know. What do you do?

- D. Ignore it

4) You've read a nasty comment about one of your friends. How do you react?

25 - 28 POINTS

Chat with some friends about what else you can all do to keep cyber safe.

20- 24 POINTS

Okay! You could probably make a lot more effort to stay safe online. You may find that you sometimes get caught up in the fun of social media and online apps without thinking about the dangers involved. Try to think of introducing privacy settings to your SM accounts and be conscious to report anything negative your encounter. Talk to a friend or teacher about how you could improve your cyber safety knowledge, and score.

8- 19 POINTS

Oh dear! It seems like you really don't know a lot about staying safe online. Although the internet may seem like just a bit of fun, you need to be aware that it can also be quite dangerous and that what you and others post can hurt another's feelings, Also remember; not everyone is who they say they are and that it is important to report anything or anyone that may seem a little suspicious. Speak to a teacher or adult about your score and ask about ways you could get more internet safety savvy.
