This Autumn, we are excited to offer a new range of workshops for KS3 and KS4 pupils, exploring the legacy of the Windrush Generation in The Empire Windrush; Then and Now, and considering and celebrating the achievements of notable historical and contemporary figures in Black and British.

Black and British

During this workshop pupils will explore the exceptional achievements of both contemporary and historical influential and notable Black British figures, examining their core values and considering how their contributions inspires an inclusive society.

The workshop will support students to:

- Identify the achievements of some of the most influential, yet least well known Black British figures in history and modern day.
- Name and talk about the experiences and contribution made by black people in Britain before 1948
- Explore the many roles Black people have played in Britain
- Have conversations about what we can do to ensure we play an active role in exploring, celebrating and educating ourselves and others about the positive role Black people play, and have always played, in our lives.
- Consider inclusion, what that means, how that feels
- Consider difference and how it enhances society

The Empire Windrush – Then and Now

This 60 minute interactive workshop encourages pupils to work collaboratively to consider the experiences of the passengers who travelled to England in 1948 on The Empire Windrush. Activities will explore how this shaped post war multi-cultural Britain, reflecting on the legacy of Windrush on modern day Britain and the wider world.

The workshop will support pupils to:

- Understand the links between Britain and the Caribbean
- Learn about the contribution of different groups in the development of multi-cultural Britain
- Reflect on the voices and experience of Black people
- Consider the impact of the migration of people to, from and within the British Isles.
- Develop historical perspective about cultural diversity
- Identify and understand the changing nature of rules, laws and the justice system

Workshops will utilise a variety of creative activities and skills including storytelling, reasoning, debating, improvising, devising, voice work, physical theatre and movement skills. Activities are supported by a variety of multimedia including images, video and audio excerpts.

COSTS
