- Make it our priority that everyone with whom we work knows and understands that we will
  challenge all acts of direct and indirect racism in our workplace, whether that be training
  venues, schools, colleges and/or community settings.
- Ensure we openly discuss the opportunities through which we can develop new and existing programmes to be more directed towards exploring Black Lives Matter where possible.
- Fully support all staff and students who experience racial prejudice and work with them towards a resolution whereby they can comfortably and happily return to work and/or play.
