BIGFOOT'S PROGRAMME AIMS TO:

- Introduce, via video, 'Little Amal' and her message of hope for all displaced people, but especially child refugees.
- Help children understand that a refugee's story is one of potential, success, respect, hospitality and kindness
- Introduce Refugee Week's 'Simple Acts Campaign'
- Empower young people to be pro-active by promoting the importance of simple acts of kindness and messages of welcome
- Educate young people about the term 'refugee'
- Celebrate the amazing contributions refugees make to our lives, schools and local communities
- Improve the understanding about why a person may seek safety and asylum
- To accept and respect each other's differences
- To learn how to empathise with others

Following an inspiring 30 minute whole school assembly, classes will be invited to participate in more specific sessions to further understand what compassion is and how this relates to refugees, along with how empathy can be tangibly realised through 'Simple Acts' of kindness. Students will be encouraged to embrace the idea that refugees are strong, creative, intelligent and resourceful individuals who should be celebrated in our schools and wider communities.

The programme is accompanied by a resource pack, which includes information sheets, worksheets and pre & post workshop ideas in order to make the programme completely sustainable.
